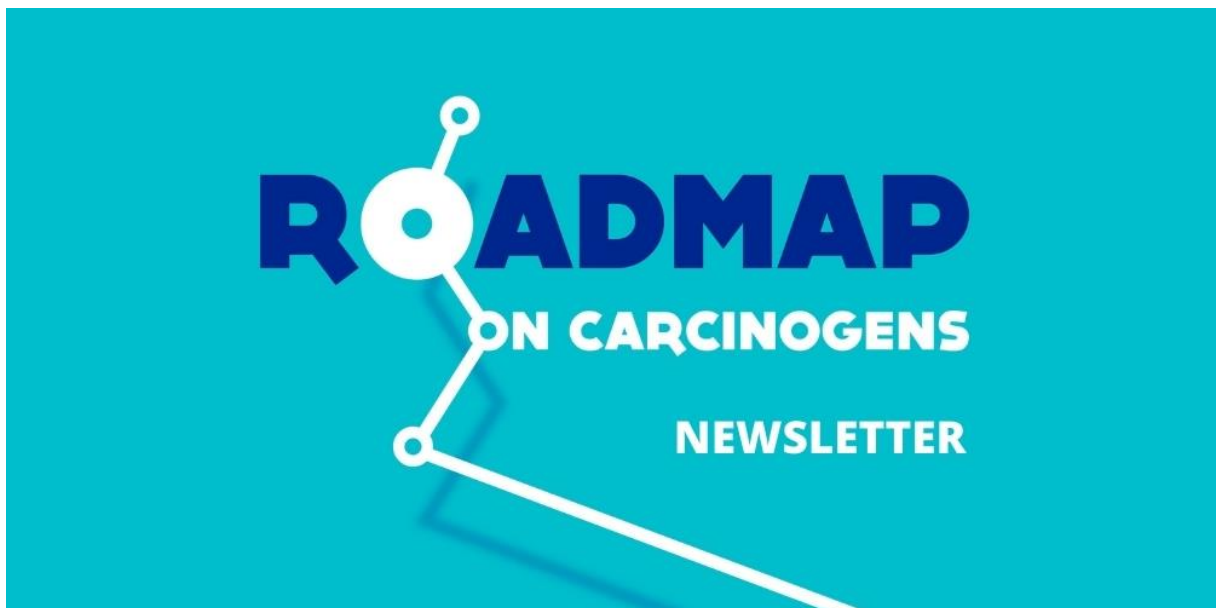

Results Roadmap on Carcinogens 2.0

On June 12 and 13 the Belgian Presidency of the Council of the European Union organised and hosted the successful conference where the Roadmap partners formally concluded the second phase of the Roadmap on Carcinogens. Many new results from the 12 challenges that marked the Roadmap 2.0 were presented, such as the [substitution strategies](#), new and updated [factsheets](#) and '[education is key](#)'.

The results of all the challenges will be implemented in the new website that will be launched in fall 2024. You can expect direct access to helpful knowledge and tools to prevent you and/or your company from exposure to cancer-causing agents.

Ongoing commitment throughout Europe in RoC 3.0

During the closing conference on June 13, the Roadmap partners signed the covenant for a new phase of the Roadmap on Carcinogens. With the signing of the covenant, 9 EU-member states, BusinessEurope (European employers), European Trade Union Confederation (ETUC – European workers), the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work (EU-OSHA), the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) and the European Commission, renewed their commitment to this EU voluntary action scheme to prevent workers from exposure to carcinogens in the workplace.

Also, we are excited to welcome two additional partners for the next phase, the Norwegian National Institute of Occupational Health (STAMI) and EU-member state Ireland.



Guidance risk assessments lead exposure

In a risk assessment, special hazards for particularly vulnerable groups of employees must be taken into account. One of these groups are expectant or breastfeeding mothers. Lead exposure, for example, can harm the (unborn) child.

This guidance can help you carry out the risk assessment regarding maternity protection with professional expertise and gives instructions regarding maternity protection for workplaces with lead exposure. For more information on this carcinogen, you can check out our fact sheet about lead.

Consultation scientific reports for OELs

As part of the process for establishing occupational exposure limits (OELs), ECHA have prepared a scientific report for consideration by the Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC). The consultations are held to allow parties to comment on the report and to support RAC in adopting an opinion on occupational exposure limits.

ECHA are seeking comments on their scientific report for occupational exposure limits on:

- 1,3-Propanesultone, Ethylene dibromide (EDB) or 1,2-Dibromoethane
Deadline to comment 12 August 2024
- N-(hydroxymethyl)acrylamide
Deadline to comment 2 September 2024
- Anthraquinone, Butanone oxime and Acetone oxime
Deadline to comment 16 September 2024
